

REFLECTIONS

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven ..." Ecclesiastes 3:1

In other words, life is a matter of knowing what time it is.

As we come into the season of Advent, that is always the first question. The rest of the world has already started Christmas – what are we doing? What is this season for? How do we make the most of this precious time that we have been given?

Advent is, first of all, a time of preparation. Especially given the way that the celebration of Christmas has evolved in our culture, this time of preparation is vital. There is just so much to do, and it seems there is hardly enough time to get it all done. There are cookies to bake and parties to organize and decorations to put up and meals to plan and gifts to purchase and cards to send and on and on. Sometimes the weight of those preparations threatens the enjoyment of the holiday to come, which is not good.

One would hope that the preparations would carry a joy of their own, that they would create a sense of anticipation and expectation that would fully set the stage for this day of great joy. Christmas is not a test we have to pass. It is an opportunity, a moment that has been given us to be renewed in faith and hope. Like an athlete training for a big game, we prepare for the coming of the child the Bethlehem with gratitude and excitement.

We are blessed to even be invited to this birthday party.

Advent is also a time of waiting, of patience. We are not good at waiting - which is probably why we fill these days with so much busy activity. We live in a world that is driven by outcomes, a world that does not believe it can be happy without reward and success. We are consumed by the fear of what lies ahead, beyond our control.

But patience is the great gift of faith. Learning to wait, learning to be present right where we are, accepting that this moment is enough, is the great secret to happiness and health. We cannot confess our trust in God without living believing that he will, in fact, deliver on the promise of the coming Savior.

And now we prepare. And we wait for the realization of that coming.

Advent is a passage, a pilgrimage, a journey toward and for something amazing. Our preparations are not odious chores, they are the actualization of what we wait for. Waiting is not a punishment; it is an opportunity to make the most of the moment to come even before we herald its arrival. We are not merely counting down - we are counting on, counting on this gift that God is about to birth among us.

Something great is about to happen in the world. This is the time to do the work of preparation, to actively engage together and be ready in heart and soul. For the gift of the future that is coming upon us. This is the time to wait well - with patience and hope and good cheer in the assurance of God's promise.

The day of great blessing is nigh. Let us prepare for the coming of our King!


