Pastor Glen

They all met together and were constantly united in prayer, along with Mary the mother of Jesus, several other women, and the brothers of Jesus. Acts 1:14

Thom Ranier, author of The Post Quarantine Church, points to this verse to remind us of something we all already know: the importance of prayer in the life of faith. A bit too on the nose, perhaps, but in this moment in time and history, more important than ever.

There is much speculation these days about what is happening in the world. We are living in rapidly changing times, perhaps historically changing times, and it's not perfect clear right now what the path forward will be like or what we should be doing about it. We have two things going for us: we know where all of this is leading, and we have a great gift to help us in the meantime.

Prayer.

In the first days of the Christian community, as the disciples still wondered at the empty tomb and what it meant, they turned it to the one thing they knew for sure. The God who answers prayer. For us, in these uncertain times, that's a really good place to turn as well. We can learn from the disciples, we can learn from our forbearers, we can learn from Luther and from the catechism, how and when to pray. As we turn into 2022, let us rededicate ourselves to this most important gift of God.

Ranier reminds us of four things:

1. The disciples met together for prayer. Prayer wasn't simply an individual spiritualistic exercise, but the shared work of the entire community. While it is difficult (even dangerous) for us to gather together publicly right now in the midst of the ongoing pandemic, we must be creative in finding ways to share together the experience of prayer. We must not neglect the importance of community in our faith practice. And surely one of our prayers will always be that God will bring an end to the pandemic so that we can be safely together again.

- 2. The disciples prayed frequently. We must learn, each of us, to have prayer become more than a once-a-week-experience that happens on Sunday morning. We need to find ways to grow our daily prayer habits. We need tools and mutual encouragement to make this happen. For many of us this may become something brand new. For all of us this will be something life changing.
- **3.** The disciples prayed constantly. Prayer is more than a religious activity, it is a posture of life, a spirituality that invades every moment of our day. A regular habit of daily devotion is a wonderful and important thing, but its ultimate purpose is to change the way we see and feel about everything we do and about who we are. We are called to place the entirety of our existence into God's hands. Developing a habit of prayer is the beginning of developing a prayerful life.
- **4. The disciples prayed with great devotion.** Our saving grace in every trying time is the faith we have in the promise of God. It is not enough to know that we can depend on him, it is necessary for us to live out that faith and trust in every moment. Developing the spiritual tool of prayer both comes from and contributes to a closer relationship with God, which is the entire purpose of faith after all. A life centered on the Word of God and deeply engaged in prayer is a life filled with hope and joy. It is the life we need right now.

Beginning in January we will turn to the topic of prayer at every opportunity. We will found our conversations on the Lord's Prayer, and use Jesus teachings to help us grow in spirit and in faith. We will return to Luther's words in the small catechism about prayer. And in doing so, we will find the strength, the patience, the love, and the hope we need on this journey to wherever we are going.

We will get closer to God, and we will see his Kingdom unfold among us.


