### Movies based on comic books used to be much easier to understand.

There were good guys and bad guys and it was easy to tell them

apart. There was an order to things. In the beginning, the bad guys tried to do something they shouldn't (like take over the world) and in the end the good guys stopped them. Maybe the good guys have some flaws, maybe the bad guys were greedy and cunning enough to make it look like they were going to win, but there could really only be one ending because that's how the world works. It just made sense.



Evidently now, at least according to the movies like this year's Marvel blockbuster, there is more than one universe. And how are we supposed to make sense of that?

The idea of "multiverses" was actually first suggested by ancient Greek philosophers, but took shape as a modern idea in the 1950's thanks to the writings of the prominent physicist Erwin Schrödinger who suggested that in every moment, anything that could happen actually did happen, and so multiple new "universes" were constantly being created as a result of human choices. An infinite number of universes, as limitless as the choices we make every day and just as hard to understand.

Lately the world feels just like that -a maze of incomprehensible outcomes, each worse than the other.

Except it's not like that at all.

The confusion we deal with every day, the overwhelming sense that life and the world is spiraling out of our control is an illusion, a self-created mirage that is the singular result of our lack of faith. We have forsaken the promise that there is only one truth, only one universe, only the life and light that comes from the grace of God. The rest – the corruption, violence, hatred, ruin that seems to define life –is a lie, a replay of the original lie first given voice in the Garden of Eden.

There is no life for us outside of God. There is no path for us except grace. And what we see, the chaos that seems to threaten us, is of our own creation, the result of pretending that we are in charge.

We are not.

And it's time we started living like we knew that. And believed that.

It's not about choices, at least not in the way that we think about that word. It is about determination, about clinging to hope and striving daily to walk within the boundaries of grace and love. It is about the constant work of forsaking the desires of our own will and humbling ourselves to what is "more excellent." It is about refusing to earn what has already been freely given. It is about stifling our native urge for be a me and developing the skills we need to be an us.

It's about believing in the choice already made for us.

Faith is not about navigating a multitude of possibilities for life. Faith is about knowing the God who has already has made the only choice for us that matters. A life of faith, a life of that faith, is a very different life indeed.

Rudyard Kipling defined life as the ability to "meet with Triumph and Disaster and treat those two impostors just the same." Sin is the fear that the random circumstances of the world have some ultimate meaning. The stock market declines and we believe the world is going to end. Our local sports team wins a championship and we're on top of the world. War breaks out in Europe and we start hoarding canned goods. We bounce back and forth based on headlines in the nightly news, we base our lives on what scares us the most or makes our endorphins flow. We act and live as if this world was our god.

It's not.

The resurrection is not merely a reward for surviving this world – it is a Word that overrides the hold that this world has on us and frees us to move through it with grace and hope. Resurrection gives us the confidence to do the right thing when we must and endure the wrongs that come our way. Resurrection is the power of truth that overrides the prison of lies in which we live.

Follow the path of truth, and it will set you free!
