Pastor Glen

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. Luke 9:51

A lot of stuff in the Bible happens in really unpleasant places.

Moved to an unsettled, unfamiliar land. In slavery in Egypt. Forty years in the Sinai desert. Exiled to Babylon. Under centuries a foreign oppression. In a stable in an unremarkable rural village. Cast by the Devil into the wilderness for 40 days. In the distant reaches of Galilee. In Samaria and other Gentile lands outside of Judea. On a garbage dump of a hill called Calvary.

Why is it so hard for us to deal with unpleasant places? If Jesus could handle it, why can't we?

We are creatures addicted to comfort and security. We like things the way we like things. We do not like to be in strange places or cold places or hard places. When we come to the difficult parts of our journey we want to get through them as quickly as we can. We were not made for hardship and we do not endure it well.

We think we are entitled to better. We are wrong.

Faith is not the promise that things will always be perfect. Or easy. Or even bearable sometimes. The power of grace is not to keep us from what is hard, it is the presence of God with us when things are not. Our unwillingness to do the hard things, our impulse to flee when we are challenged, is a measure of our lack of faith. We need to do better. We need to strengthen the muscles of our spiritual life so that we cannot just endure hard things but live and work and continue and even thrive in those places.

That's why we do Lent.

Lent is not about feeling bad about ourselves or sorry for ourselves or adopting a false posture of humility. Lent is about walking boldly and faithfully through the reality of this world, both that of our own creation and that which is the necessity of our humanity. Lent is a time to make an honest acknowledgement of our plight and our neighbors as well. Lent is for honest lament, forthright confession, and rededication to our calling as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Lent is not for the meek of heart. It is for the blessed meek who are willing to walk step by step with Jesus on the path to Calvary.

It is an inescapable truth that our unwillingness and inability to face the realities of our humanness and what we have done to our world has only made life harder and has only made the world a worse place. Avoidance is the work of the devil. He tempts Jesus with the opportunity to remake the world as he sees fit and to avoid the path that is set before him. "It doesn't have to be this bad," he offers. Jesus responds, "It's not up to us."

That is our constant temptation, to avoid suffering, to seek a better life, no matter the cost to us or to our neighbors. We yearn for power and beauty and glory and it is killing us. We need to face that impulse, and we need to change.

Hello Lent.

Lent is not about becoming better people so that we can live easier lives. Lent is about becoming better people so that we can live the lives we have better. Lent is about the transformative power of grace to aid and guide us in our journey. God is leading us to a new life, a resurrected life, an Easter life. But that life comes only as we pass along the way of the cross. The glory we seek is not our own. The life we are given is not one we will have earned or deserved. It will come only as a gift of grace, and it will come to us as we pass through this one.

We do not come into Lent seeking a different way. We come into Lent that we might better travel the way we have been given. May the grace of God guide us now as we begin the journey.


