Pastor Glen

In the summer of 1991 Lorie and I had a unique (to us) experience. We sublet an apartment for a few months while we were inbetween times and places of our lives.

It was an interesting experience.

It was, first of all, truly helpful. We were moving between seminary, internship, CPE, a job in Lincoln and a (hoped for) eventual permanent residence there, so our options were pretty limited at the time. Through a friend-of-a-friend type of connection, we found this small but fun little apartment near downtown which served our needs quite well.

Then, the last week we were there, the bathroom in the apartment upstairs flooded and the ceiling in the apartment we were subletting caved in. Embarrassing!

Taking care of something that doesn't belong to you is hard. Taking care of the things that do belong to you is hard enough! One would hope that ownership, the intersection of desire and acquisition, would evoke a sense of joy and care that guided us to higher levels of responsibility and dedication. It doesn't always work that way.

In this disposable culture we have developed the nasty habit of using and losing, of taking what we want and then dumping it when it doesn't satisfy us anymore. Our landfills brim with the refuse of our existence. Modern products come with planned obsolescence, tech gadgets are constantly updated so that we must keep buying the new and discarding the old.

That mindset comes to dominate the culture. People are discardable, old friendships are tossed away, marriages are too easily broken, commitments to institutions are about as permanent as any brand loyalty. And the fringes of society are filled with "disposable" people – the poor and few that we cannot integrate and are simply ignored.

That we are not good stewards of the gifts we have is bad. That we

are bad stewards of people is the brokenness that is destroying our world. That we believe the world is ours to do with as we choose is sin.

True stewardship requires us to know that we are called to take care of what is not ours. As Luther taught in the catechism, "I believe that God has created me and all that exists; that he has given me and still sustains my body and soul, all my limbs and senses, my reason and all the faculties of my mind, together with food and clothing, house and home, family and property; that he provides me daily and abundantly with all the necessities of life ..." (Apostle's Creed, Article III). We are not owners, we are caretakers, which sets a higher standard for stewardship. What does it mean for us to take care of that which belongs to God?

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus tells the parable of a Master who left his estate in the hands of his servants, two of whom tended their charges and saw their investments grow, and one who in fear hid his portion and wasted the opportunity. But we should not be so focused on the relative success or failure of three servants that we miss the foundation truth that drives the parable: whatever they have, and whatever they do with it, it all comes from and returns to God. That is the very definition of stewardship – we are caretakers of what is not ours.

Our lives are defined by possession, whether it be our material goods, or our accomplishments, or even the people in our lives. Re-defining ourselves as stewards frees us from the imprisoning power of possession and opens up the path to a life of discipleship, of service, of purpose. Our casual disregard for the world around us is a symptom of despair. We have lost sight of eternity so we devalue all things in the present. Even all people.

Life in the hope of resurrection sees the hand of the creator in everything and everyone around us, and so we take exceptional care of what has been placed in our hands.

God has given us this gift and this mission that we call St. Matthew. Shall we be found to be good and faithful stewards?


