REFLECTIONS

The other day I had a chance to take a long drive across the state on a beautiful sunny fall day, and the unmistakable signs were there to see: the season has changed. It's time for harvest.

Being a good Nebraskan I love this season as much as anyone. Lots of people love fall - the changing colors, the cooler evenings, football. But in Nebraska it's not just fall. It's harvest. It is a season of destiny, a purpose, of fulfillment. It's a season of hard work. It is the grand celebration that we have done what needed doing, and the promise of faithful labor bearing fruit. It is that time of the year that reminds the world of why this particular corner of it matters so, so, much.

Every religion, from the beginnings of the human race, has contained some celebration of the act of harvest. The bringing in of the sheaves reminds us of the abundance of God's provision and the goodness of his bounty. For three seasons of the year we proclaim that God provides. In the time of harvest that hope becomes reality.

It is truly an amazing thing to see what this earth can bring forth, what God can make of our skills and our laborers. At the end of this season we will hold in our hands everything necessary for the well-being of the entirety of humanity, if we will just but use it that way. There is a sense of well-being that only comes at harvest.

It is the most hopeful time of the year.

At our worst, of course, there is something else in the air. Fall is a time of endings. The comedian Jim Gaffigan does a bit where he reminds us that the changing foliage marks the death of the leaves on the trees, and he wonders at our joy over that phenomenon. But harvest is not about endings. This season does not merely mark the end of planting and tending. That work was done in preparation for what lies ahead. We do not merely harvest for its own sake, that we should marvel at our abundance or rest on our laurels. We gather the fruits of the earth so that we might be equipped for the days that lie ahead.

Harvest is the season of preparation. We are not merely thankful that we have made it this far. We are turning now toward what is yet to come.

Harvest is the season of gratitude. After all, our national day of Thanksgiving comes when the harvest is done and the larders are full. This is the time (perhaps even more than any other time) that we give thanks to God for all his good gifts and the grace he showers upon us. But our gratitude serves a greater purpose - it empowers us for the days ahead and it fills us with hope.

Hope realized in the tangible reality of the harvest. Hope that serves the incarnate work of discipleship.

Yes, this is the most hopeful time of the year.



HICKORY STREET HOUSE UPDATE

The sale of Saint Matthew's Hickory Street property is now complete. On June 26th at a Special Congregational Meeting, St. Matthew members voted 44 - 4 to sell the property at 5851 Hickory street. Several significant repairs were performed, mostly funded by insurance claims, over the course of the past summer and early fall.

The Congregation Council received a purchase offer for \$240,000 on September 7th, which was accepted (the purchasers are midtown Omaha residents). The transaction closed on Tuesday, October 18th. Sale proceeds to Saint Matthew were greater than 98.5% of the purchase price. No sales commission was paid. The Council is in the process of designing guidelines for the management of these significant funds.

Numerous members of the Saint Matthew family, including friends of the Congregation and Council members, all worked intensely to prepare the property, and conduct the sale. Thank you to all those who contributed their time and energies to support this effort!




have you all to thank for your generosity in making that happen.
