

They will be wrong. 2021 will be the year that matters. It's not the tragedy we have been through that will change us. It's what we do next that will matter. And it's all about how we complete this sentence, "The first thing I'm going to do is ..."

After 12 months of being banned from so much of what we know, what we care about, what we want, we are nearing an end. There is a light at the end of the tunnel, and it's beckoning us forward, leading us somewhere. Whether it is back to what used to be, or on to something entirely new, is yet to be seen. And we have a role to play in that.

So what do you want to do first?

You probably have a long list. Surely it includes some very basic things – eating at a restaurant, going to a movie theater. Undoubtedly there are many much more essential simple things – shaking someone's hand, having a face-to-face conversation, hugging a grandchild. Sitting in church? A long catalog of unhappiness and emptiness calls out to us with urgency and hope. We can hardly wait. Except ...

... what you probably think is the first thing may not actually be the first thing.

Wisdom tells us that journeys are determined in their first steps. That's why faith is so focused on baptism. Our first step is chosen by the Holy Spirit, and we live in the constant promise is that when we lose the path (which we mostly always do) we can return to the place where it all began and try again. Now, as we take that first huge step away from where we have been into what is next, let make it a good step!

Karl Vaters suggests that we ask ourselves some questions:

Are we representing Jesus well as we come out of the lockdown? Among the many outcomes of the pandemic, the world is enduring a great spiritual crisis. Not that we haven't been in the midst of one before, but this past year has amplified the tremendous challenge of faithfulness

Even as we have added new technologies to our ministry tools as a matter of survival, we have discovered their potential to affect our calling to share the good news of Jesus Christ with others. Online community is unchartered waters for us, but the community of faith has always been called to grow in its witness and service to the world.

How are people hurting, and what can we do to help them? There can be no doubt that this year of social distancing has affected everyone. There has been abundant suffering and there will be abundant grief left in its wake. Easter people are needed more than ever now. Our message of hope and new life will be the salvation of the world.

> In-Person Worship



In-person Worship in the Church is beginning

Limited in-person, indoor worship will begin on April 4th (Easter Sunday). We can accommodate about 25 persons into the sanctuary and maintain necessary social distancing. ADVANCE RESERVATIONS WILL BE REQUIRED. The only way to reserve your space is to contact Pastor Glen directly by calling or texting him at 402-740-6395. You will be required to follow these guidelines:

- Everyone MUST wear a face covering (masks will be available for anyone who does not have one.
- Use hand sanitizer (will be available in several locations including narrhex and pews).
- Restrooms will be limited to one person at a time (a parent may accompany a child). Each individual using the restroom will be responsible for wiping down and sanitizing after use per posted instructions.
- Attendance limited to 25 persons per worship service for in-person inside services.
- Reservations are required in advance. Reservations can only be made by calling Pastor's cell phone (402) 740-6395. The deadline for making a reservation is Wednesday night. Anyone without a reservation cannot attend the in-person inside service.
- Social distancing will be in place. Pews have been marked to maintain social distancing. Family members living in the same house may sit together subject to the ability to accommodate them and maintain appropriate social distancing for all in attendance. Non-family members MUST maintain 6 foot social distancing.
- Attendees will be directed to their designated seat (it will not be open seating). Pews will be filled from the front of the church to the back of the church. After the service attendees will be dismissed one row at a time starting from the back of the church.

> In-Person Worship (cont.)

- Single use bulletins and pre-packaged communion elements will be in the narthex. Please pick up what you need on your way into the Sanctuary. After the service, please dispose of your used bulletin and the empty communion elements in the provided receptacle as you exit the church (do not leave your trash in the pews).
- There will be no sharing of peace or shaking of hands.
- Offering plate will be in the narthex.
- We cannot allow social gatherings before or after the service. When you are dismissed you must leave the church immediately. Please do not congregate in the narthex or outside the church.
- Children attending the service must remain with their parent(s)/guardian(s). Congregating or interacting with other children outside their immediate family (those living together) cannot be permitted. The nursery must remain closed.
- Doors will be held open by an usher (gloves will be provided) or propped open in order to avoid multiple persons having to touch common door handles.

This will be our plan through April and May. In addition, we will have outdoor worship services in the North parking lot on the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 10:30 am. Mask wearing and social distancing guidelines will also be used for outdoor services. In case of unpleasant weather, you can stay in your car and listen on your radio.

We will continue to closely monitor the infection and hospitalization levels in Douglas county and these plans may change at any time.

Please remember: as long as the virus is active in the community, it remains a threat to spread and infect others or mutate into new forms that may be hard to contain. It is our Godly duty to behave responsibly for the safety of all of our neighbors. These safety practices are our way of showing our faithfulness to the values of the Kingdom of God.

Christian Symbol

LILY—The lily that blooms around Easter is a symbol of Christ's resurrection because it rises from a seemingly lifeless bulb decaying in the ground. It is also used as a symbol of Christ himself. The lily, a symbol of purity, is often used to represent the Virgin Mary.

Believing

Sometimes we get caught up in thinking we need to understand God in order to have faith. But faith is more about trust than knowledge; it's more about believing in someone than believing information. A child, for instance, doesn't have to know the precise roads to Grandma's house; he only needs to believe *in* his parents and their ability and desire to get him there safely. Similarly, we need not understand all the intricacies of how God works; we can take a cue from the disciples and let belief *in* the risen Christ transform and empower us.

In the words of Madeleine L'Engle (*The Rock That Is Higher*): "The disciples did not bother to try to understand the resurrection body. They doubted, and then they believed. They believed something so wonderful that it changed this broken, fragmented, beaten-down little group of men and women in a moment from depression to enthusiasm, from despair to new life, vibrant and unafraid."


