

Unmute.

It happens when you're in a zoom meeting. Out of an abundance of politeness you have muted your own microphone so that the other people on the meeting don't have to listen to the strange noises from your home. But then you want to speak and you forget that you have muted yourself. Luckily, everyone can see, and so they are all waving their arms and raise their voices and tell you to unmute yourself.

It is both embarrassing and funny. And somewhat metaphorical for life.

We spend too much of our life muted, unable or unwilling to speak truth about ourselves or about our world, unwilling to challenge faithlessness and injustice wherever we meet it. Whether it is because we are trying too hard to be nice or just because we are afraid, too many important things go unsaid. And we are the worst for it. And the world is the worst for it.

But now the world is waving its arms and yelling at us to get our attention, that we might in Word and deed proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ and fulfill our calling. The events of the year past have opened our eyes to the effects of our complicit silence, and we should be silent no longer. We have something important to say. We have something the world needs to hear. This is our time.

Lent is a season for repentance. Not just for feeling bad about ourselves or the things that we've done, but to reflect on who we are and the path we're traveling and make an important turn and go in a new direction . That is the very definition of repentance. In 2021, that means unmuting and telling ourselves and the world the truth that must be spoken.

1. We must speak out against the temptations of this world, the lure of wealth and power, the cynicism and skepticism that keeps us from taking our faith seriously. We must be honest about our weaknesses in the face of evil, and remember who it is that we belong to.

- 2. We must tell the true story of a faith, not a gospel of glory or prosperity, but one that leads to Jerusalem and the cross that waits there. We must be willing to follow Jesus, and we must tell the world what that means in full. The church has filled the world with false hope and people are lost. We must do better.
- 3. We must loudly and clearly preach the values of the Kingdom of God, of justice and peace. We must be willing to do the hard work of standing against greed and corruption, both in the world around us and even in the church. It is not enough for us to be charitable. We must stand against those who would use religion to advance their own agendas.
- 4. We must speak the love of God. We must recapture the proclamation that "God so love the world that he gave his only son." We cannot allow the gospel to be subverted into a message of hate and judgment. We must dare to let the world know that we believe in love.
- 5. We must, by word and example, be the people of the cross. We must find the courage to live lives of service and sacrifice, even as Jesus showed us himself. we must be willing to sacrifice everything for the sake of our redemption. We must be willing to sacrifice everything for the sake of the world's redemption.

It has been noted that all it takes for evil to succeed is for good people to remain silent. Our inability and unwillingness to speak out has enabled the problems that we face in our own lives and empowered the struggles of the world. We have an important and sacred mission. We are the instruments of grace in the world, and we can no longer afford to shirk our duty. We need this new life.

May our Lenten journey guide us and strengthen us in our discipleship, that being found faithful we might be raised with Christ come Easter morning.




