

Why does the sunshine seem so much brighter in the winter?



Maybe it's the added light of the reflection off of the new fallen snow. Perhaps it's just the emergence of the sun from underneath the grey clouds that seem all too dominant during the winter months. Possibly it's just that there are so few hours of sunlight during the day that each ray is all the more cherished. Whatever the reason, there is nothing like a sunny winter day.

We're going to need some of those now.

There will be a great desire within us to try to quickly put the past year behind us, to move away from the tragedies and challenges of the past months and pretend that all of it really did not happen, to get back to "normal" (an empty word now that only signals the depth of denial that pervades our souls.) That will not be good enough. In fact, that will be worse. If we cannot bring some meaning to, learn some lessons from what we have endured, gain some understanding of ourselves and our own culpability for the world in which we live, then we will not, nor should not, move on.

We cannot just move on. We are prisoners of an eternal winter of brokenness, of misspent grace and denied discipleship, and we will remain so. This past year was not an aberration, and we cannot just blame what has happened on the calendar. 2021 was created by the nexus of several strains of ancient sin – self-centeredness, violence, greed, and hatred, to name a few – abetted by a church sold out to worldly power and wealth. It was no accident. We caused all of this. Which means we can change it.

We can be the ray of sunshine on a winter day.

How will the grace of God break through in these dark days? As it always has – through his faithful chosen instruments. Through us. Through our desire for justice, through our compassion for our neighbors both near and far, by his word and the Spirit of our baptism, his promised reign will be established forever and ever Amen.

There will be hope. No longer will we cower of fear of tomorrow nor hide from the future. We will willingly and



purposefully travel the path before us, knowing that we go as we have been directed and that our Savior walks with us, helping us when we stumble and picking us up when we fall.

There will be joy. We will cast off the shadows that loom about us. We do not deny the truth of pain and suffering that comes with this life, but even in its midst of it we will not lose sight of God's presence and sustaining grace in all things, and for that we are constantly thankful.

There will be love. We will live everyday by grace, by the unconditional, undeserved love of God in Jesus Christ. We must face our brokenness with honesty and courage, learning from our failures to do better, to grow in discipleship and move closer, day by day, to the envisioned Kingdom of God.

There will be peace. We will learn to love ourselves as God loves us, to restrain the sin that chafes against faith, to let go of our own striving and our own cravings and allow ourselves to be used as God chooses to use us.

Those are the elements of winter light - hope, joy, love and peace. These are the gifts of faith, the fruits of the Spirit, the artifacts of baptism. This is what is different about us, and this is why we are here.

Let us resolve to make 2021 the year that the followers of Jesus make a difference.




