Pastor Glen

It is an old, old story of kings and kingdoms, of people and prophets, of days of hopefulness and days of destruction. It moves from initial struggles to glorious triumph to devasting failure. It speaks to us across the ages of how difficult it is to build a world and be a community and keep faith with the God of our covenant.

It is the story of the Kingdom called Israel. And the ending is waiting to be written. By us.

Shall we begin?

The story begins with a King named Saul, the first to take on the previously unheld title and responsibility. Like all first efforts at something that had never been done before, it did not end well. Even though God had chosen Saul to be the King, he fell out of God's favor and God moved on.

God moved on to David, a "man after God's own heart" as we are told. He emerges from nowhere, the youngest of the nine sons of Jesse, a shepherd boy elevated by God's selection and not by his merit. He demonstrates his faithfulness (not his courage) in facing the Philistine champion Goliath, he demonstrates his tactical skill leading the Israelites in battle, he demonstrates his piety in poetry and song. And he demonstrates his brokenness with Bathsheba. In all of that he will be remembered as the greatest King of Israel, his reign will be known as its Golden Age, and generations to come will wait anxiously and expectantly for his return.

And then will come Solomon, the son of David and Bathsheba. His days will be filled with prosperity and power and peace. His palace will be the envy of every nation, and they will come from far to behold his wisdom and grace. He will build the House of God as a place of worship for generations. Yet his court will be filled with foreign wives and concubines, and his house will be tainted by the worship of other gods. The end of his reign will be the end of the United Kingdom, and his heirs will know division, war, failure and ruin.

In the years that followed there will be good Kings and bad Kings, faithful Kings and faithless Kings. Sometimes the Kingdom will flourish, sometimes it will fall apart. God will send his prophets to remind the Kings and the peoples of his covenant. Sometimes they will listen, sometimes they will not.

Not unlike our world today.

The stories of the Kings of Israel and the kingdoms of Israel reach to us across the generations, sometimes holding up a mirror to our own times, sometimes lighting a path for us to move forward. It is not enough to read these stories merely as history. It is not enough to know the names, the dates, the places. It is necessary for us to make these stories our own, that they might shape our life and our faith and our world. These stories are not about people who lived a long time ago. These stories are about us.

There are other characters in these stories. There are the prophets, the mouthpieces of God to the world in those days. And there are the people of the Kingdom who must discern both the needs of their world and the will of God. Living in the Kingdom of this world calls for a difficult navigation of what is true and right and good. Living in the Kingdom of this world requires us to hear the Word of God and keep it faithfully. Living in the Kingdom of this world is hard and challenging, and sometimes we fail, and sometimes by his grace we will stumble forward. Whatever may happen, the journey continues.

And we have not yet reached the end.

Perhaps that is why these stories are so important for us now. They give us help and hope as we move along, as we are writing our own. We know where God is leading us. We are still trying to figure out how to get there. And most of all, we are trying to figure out how to get there faithfully. Our calling is tied to the past, even as it stretches toward the future. And as a wise man once said, "those who do not know history are bound to repeat it."

We are not here to repeat it. We are here to fulfill it.

So let's begin, shall we?

I will post again when we have a shortage of something, but for now just pray for those who experience food insecurity and help them find a way to our doors on the third Saturday of every month.


