Foot drop is a gait abnormality in which the dropping of the forefoot happens due to weakness, irritation or damage to the common fibular nerve including the sciatic nerve, or paralysis of the muscles in the anterior portion of the lower leg. It is usually a symptom of a greater problem ...

Foot drop causes stumbling, tripping, and falling.

The thing about foot drop is that it requires constant attention when walking, which is nearly impossible to do. Try it sometime. Pay careful attention to every step you take, making extra effort to carefully lift one foot each step you take. It's hard to do. Walking should come naturally, subconsciously. Trying to do it intentionally is unnatural, and that makes it hard.

The world is suffering from foot drop.

We have been called to walk the path of discipleship with Jesus. By faith, it should come naturally, easily. But we are broken creatures, and our feet are inclined to not follow the direction of our head and hearts. At any moment, at every moment, we are prone to stumbling, tripping, falling. Unless we learn to move deliberately, purposefully, intentionally, we're going to keep falling down, again, again, again.

As I write these words, the 7 day rolling average of CoVid infections in Nebraska is 412, the same as it was a year ago. A year ago! It is as if we have learned nothing, done nothing, changed nothing. Hospitals continue to be full, people continue to die. Now cases are rising among school children. Will watching our children die be enough for us to finally take the pandemic seriously?

It's also Earth day. We are experiencing the destructive effects of the damage we have done to the creation on an ever-increasing basis. Monstrous storms, floods, droughts. The planet is slowly dying, murdered by the very beings that God created to take care of it. We are the stewards of his good creation, and we are falling flat in our stewardship calling.

This week a jury in Minnesota committed a rare act: it convicted a police officer who killed an unarmed black man. Fear of one another, especially

of people of color, has contaminated the very people whose vocation it is to protect us to the point where we have invented a new crime: driving while black, which seems to justify an immediate administration of the death penalty. Justice is failing all around us.

The work of creating a heavily armed populace is bearing great fruit though. Between terrorists with military grade weapons shooting up grocery stores and factories and teenagers with easily concealed semi-automatic pistols staging gunfights in local malls, we are all caught up in a real-life episode of The Purge. The cost of sating our addiction to violence is measured by the bodies falling all around us.

Maybe we should call it a faith drop.

People who live with disabilities like foot drop find it necessary to make use of some kind of mobility aid – a cane or a walker perhaps. There are foot and ankle braces, physical therapy and other tools to aid safe walking, to keep a person on their feet even if those feet are fully functional.

There are mobility aids for our faith, too, things to prop up us poor broken human beings, to strengthen our weaknesses, to help us keep our balance, to right us when we are leaning in the wrong direction. There is the Word of God, if we dare to understand it fully and LISTEN to what it is telling us rather than telling it what we think it should say. We can worship and pray, we can find ways to serve and give, to help and encourage our neighbor.

And we can be community.

The second great loss of the pandemic and subsequent quarantine (the first being the loss of health and life) is the separation, the loneliness, the loss of time spent with friends and family, including our church family. We are trying hard to find ways to join together now, with great hopes that we will do more if only patience and wisdom and social conscience would enable us to do what must be done to end this pandemic. I wish I could be more hopeful about that. But as we near the finish line our faith is coming up short and we are stumbling now, perhaps even failing.

We don't have to.

Through the last year (and a bit more) we have worked hard to remain connected, to worship and connect as a community of faith. It's been inadequate I know. But we have let our dissatisfaction rule us, our inability define us, and we have injured the community, stumbled in our calling. We have let anger make our decisions.

But it's not too late to regain our footing. The path has not changed, our work still lies ahead of us, and we are still St. Matthew. Now is the time for us to come back together, one way or another, to restore our support of the ministry and to be present at worship gatherings. Yes, there will only be a limited amount of in-person space at 8:30 am worship service, but there are also outdoor services on the first and third Sundays at 10:30 am. And we are always online – leave a comment and let us know you're out there!

There is an inside joke among people with MS about how long it took to concede to the illness and begin to use a cane or other needed aid. How long will it take us to confess our shortcomings and return to being Christ's church?

### > In-Person Worship

Limited in-person, indoor worship has BEGUN! We can accommodate about 25 persons into the sanctuary and maintain necessary social distancing. ADVANCE RESERVATIONS WILL BE REQUIRED. The only way to reserve your space is to contact Pastor Glen directly by calling or texting him at 402-740-6395. You will be required to follow these guidelines:

- Everyone MUST wear a face covering (masks will be available for anyone who does not have one.
- Use hand sanitizer (will be available in several locations including narthex and pews).
- Restrooms will be limited to one person at a time (a parent may accompany a child). Each individual using the restroom will be responsible for wiping down and sanitizing after use per posted instructions.
- Attendance limited to 25 persons per worship service for in-person inside services.
- Reservations are required in advance. Reservations can only be made by calling Pastor's cell phone (402) 740-6395. The deadline for making a reservation is Wednesday night. Anyone without a reservation cannot attend the in-person inside service.
- Social distancing will be in place. Pews have been marked to maintain social distancing. Family members living in the same house may sit together subject to the ability to accommodate them and maintain appropriate social distancing for all in attendance. Non-family members MUST maintain 6 foot social distancing. of the Kingdom of God.
- Attendees will be directed to their designated seat (it will not be open seating). Pews will be filled from the front of the church to the back of the church. After the service attendees will be dismissed one row at a time starting from the back of the church.
- There will be no sharing of peace or shaking of hands.

### > In-Person Worship



- Offering plate will be in the narthex.
- Single use bulletins and pre-packaged communion elements will be in the narthex. Please pick up what you need on your way into the Sanctuary. After the service, please dispose of your used bulletin and the empty communion elements in the provided receptacle as you exit the church (do not leave your trash in the pews).
- We cannot allow social gatherings before or after the service. When you are dismissed you must leave the church immediately. Please do not congregate in the narthex or outside the church.
- Children attending the service must remain with their parent(s)/guardian(s). Congregating or interacting with other children outside their immediate family (those living together) cannot be permitted. The nursery must remain closed.
- Doors will be held open by an usher (gloves will be provided) or propped open in order to avoid multiple persons having to touch common door handles.

This will be our plan through April and May. In addition, we will have outdoor worship services in the North parking lot on the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 10:30 am. Mask wearing and social distancing guidelines will also be used for outdoor services. In case of unpleasant weather, you can stay in your car and listen on your radio.

8:30 AM WORSHIP SERVICES WILL CONTINUE TO BE LIVESTREAMED ON THE CHURCH FACEBOOK PAGE AND WEBSITE.

We will continue to closely monitor the infection and hospitalization levels in Douglas county and these plans may change at any time.

Please remember: as long as the virus is active in the community, it remains a threat to spread and infect others or mutate into new forms that may be hard to contain. It is our Godly duty to behave responsibly for the safety of all of our neighbors. These safety practices are our way of showing our faithfulness to the values
