It's November and you know what that means. Time for everyone's favorite annual family gathering filled with turkeys and parades and naps during football games, seasoned this year with awkward political conversations.



In my family we are making plans for a "virtual" thanksgiving. Given that we will be mostly quarantined for a variety of reasons and farther apart from one another than usual, we're going to try to set up computer monitors at each table setting and be present together via the internet, assuming that the technology works.

I know it's not much.

But that is the day in which we live now, at the intersection of an uncontrollable disease and a grudging and incompetent response which has left us in a place of frustration and exhaustion, trying to make the best of an impossible situation. We want to be safe but we also want to have our normal lives back and we can't seem to figure out how to balance the two. We want things to be better. To now surprise, they continue to get worse.

And now, at the beginning of what experts are forecasting to be a long dark winter, we are going to sit at table, together or apart, and try to the best of our ability to summon up a spirit of thanksgiving. Here's the good news - it's already there.

Thankfulness is a gift of grace. The God who gave all for us, even the life of his own son, built into the covenant the instructions for living out our gratitude every day. Everything in the Word – the prayers, the praises, even the commandments themselves are gifts to stir up the spirit of gratefulness that is built into being a child of God.

Sometimes we catch ourselves trying to summon thankfulness by force from within or without, grasping about for something bright and shiny to focus on, listening intently for some heartwarming story, searching our memories for anything that might recreate even the smallest feeling of joy. We think it's up to us to be thankful. We believe that we need something to be thankful for. The difficulties of life, whether it be some extraordinary time like this or just the general challenges of getting by day to day, cast a shadow over our hearts and make gratitude hard.

### ➢ Hike for Hunger

**On** November 13th we will be celebrating a partnership with the US Army National Guard with a *Hike for Hunger*.

Soldiers from across Omaha will be hiking 14 miles with 30 lbs. of food on their backs to support our pantry. These men and women have volunteered to not only purchase this food for our pantry, but will carry it from the Aksarben area out along the Papio trail to Fort Street and back to the church.

If you are available on November 13th, come to the church and help show our appreciation for their service to not only our country but to our community as well. (Also I can use the help in counting and restocking the shelves!!) The estimated time that they will arrive back to the church is 11:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. I have obtained a Thrivent Action Team grant and we will use that money to provide box lunches to all the participants.

We will be practicing COVID-19 safety guidelines, so everyone will be required to wear a mask and social distance. It is our hope that the weather will cooperate and we can meet outside in the parking lot. If weather does not cooperate, we will move things inside to Fellowship Hall, so we may have to limit how many people can be in there at the same time.

### ➢ Growing Through Gratitude

**Thankfulness**, studies show, has multiple physical, mental and emotional benefits. Psychologist Robert Emmons calls gratitude "fertilizer for the mind" because of its powerful effects.

He admits gratitude isn't always easy — especially when life throws us curveballs (see the year 2020) — but says it can be most helpful during and after difficulties. Emmons suggests reframing challenges using thankfulness-based language. Ask, for example: Though I wasn't grateful for the experience at the time, how can I be now? What lessons did I learn, and how did I grow as a person?

Throughout his letters, the apostle Paul reframes his extensive sufferings and urges us to do the same. "Give thanks in all circumstances," he writes, "for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18, NIV).
